

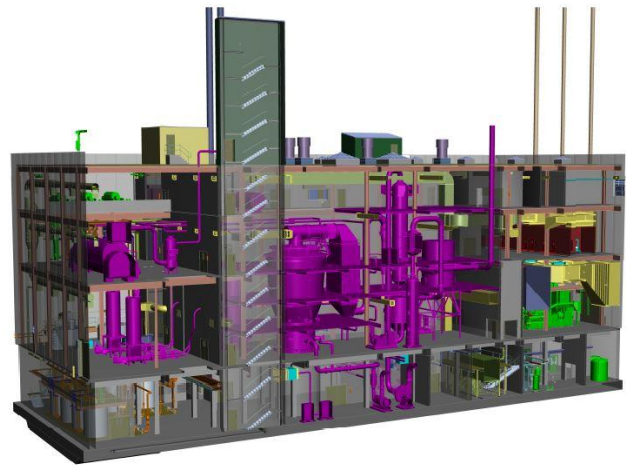

“Open House” on October 20, 2014

NEW Water invites the public to a presentation on the project’s progress

NEW Water, the brand of the Green Bay Metropolitan Sewerage District, is dedicated to the collection, treatment, and reclamation of about 38 million gallons of wastewater each day. To continue to provide safe, reliable service that you expect daily, NEW Water needs to replace its solids handling system. A new facility is needed because of aging infrastructure, stricter environmental regulations, and a need for increased capacity.

This forward-looking project is a new approach to solids handling through thermal processing and heat recovery for electricity, and will result in an approximate 50% reduction of energy costs and a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions by about 22,000 metric tons per year – the equivalent to removing about 15,000 vehicles from the road.
